RGA completed a cultural resources survey in connection with the proposed Allamuchy wireless telecommunications facility located on property owned by the Allamuchy School District. As part of the Section 106 consultation process, parties with a demonstrated interest in history or historic preservation were afforded an opportunity to review the project. The Tower Construction Notification System was utilized for consultation with Native American Tribes.

Background research determined that the project site was located on the National Register-eligible Rutherford Hall property. Rutherford Hall is significant as an excellent example of a manor house designed in the Tudor Revival style. The Phase IA archaeological survey determined that the Area of Potential Effects (APE)-Archaeology had a low sensitivity for prehistoric resources. Additionally, the potential for historic archaeological resources in the APE-Archaeology was also determined to be low, due to project site's distance from the building. Based on the results of the cultural resources survey, the NJ Historic Preservation Office determined that the tower construction would have an adverse effect on Rutherford Hall and its surrounding estate. In consultation with the NJ Historic Preservation Office and the Allamuchy Township School District, RGA drafted a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to mitigate the adverse effect.
